Updating the League guidelines

After one year of recess, all clubs are allowed to include any player without the transfer fee. Also a fee of \$200 per team (8 players recommended per team), and we will meet once a month in the top clubs of NJ and NY to play



matches. Each time, players should pay \$8 to the club which is hosting the event. Remember to wear same t-shirts and having enough t-shirts for changing during the match. The matches are 5 out 9 and we will have a round robin event (some cases two round robin events, depending of the number of teams in the division). Two top teams in highest division will play against the top 2 teams of the Capital Area League (Maryland) for the 2 spots to the Nationals 2015 in Vegas.
